General Elections and the Balance of Power

As we approach the General Elections in November, the balance of power in both Solano and Napa Counties is at stake. As always, this will be a major effort to elect, protect, and sustain pro-worker majorities across the different levels of government. Within this movement, we come together to review and endorse candidates based on their understanding of workers' issues: from fundamental workers' rights to organize and collectively bargain, to the variety of policies that support workers and their quality of life across sectors; from apprenticeship programs to strong public schools; and from good industrial and manufacturing policies to a strong and dignified public sector.

As we strategize and prepare for the General Election, we have scheduled a series of dates for endorsements. Please note the dates that candidate interviews are planned to the right - exact times and locations to be determined.

Our ultimate power is in the members and their votes, and we will be mounting an unprecedented effort to mobilize workers and voters overall to elect labor champions and pro-labor policies across the board. We strongly encourage all affiliates to participate in the process of endorsing candidates and in the field operations to reach union voters - including, but not limited to, precinct walks/literature drops, phone banks, and text banks. Pro-labor majorities in our counties, City Councils, school districts, and special districts allow us the chance to establish and defend strong labor protections and investments in good union jobs and careers. In this era of assaults on working people and democracy, it is imperative that we have labor champions to fight for the rights and advancement of workers at all levels of government.

Solano Community Benefits Coalition: 4th Monday of each month One of the primary strategies in progress for this Labor Council is the development and use of advanced labor-community coalitions. This strategy is fundamentally about identifying areas of common interest between workers and the broader community and building power together to achieve these aims.

In both Napa and Solano Counties, this Council and its affiliates and allies have developed what are known as Community Benefits Coalitions. These Coalitions aim to achieve a more equitable and sustainable form of local development and growth, including establishing high labor standards, investments in union jobs, environmental protection measures, and expanded affordable housing, amidst other priorities. These coalitions are unprecedented in the history of the two counties and aim to change the very nature of development itself in a pro-worker direction, advocating for policies and specific projects alike. At this time, the Coalitions contain labor, environmental, housing, elected officials and other community groups with a shared, pro-growth vision that defies and rejects both a race-to-the-bottom and the stagnation of austerity and inaction.

With the unprecedented investments in infrastructure coming through federal and state-level funds and the rising concerns about the housing and climate crises, there are immense opportunities to establish new and greater footholds for labor. The original labor movement rose to power through a wide combination of organizing, election victories, and coalitions, and we will press forward on all fronts to build worker power everywhere. We strongly encourage affiliates to attend and become active in these Coalitions and these efforts to strengthen the labor movement.

Board Member Highlight: G. Anthony Phillips, IATSE #16

I go by G. Anthony, Anthony, or as many of my friends and co-workers call me, "G".

I am a senior citizen who has been a Democrat before and after reaching voting age. Although I was too young to vote, the first campaign I worked for was in 1968 for Hubert Humphrey against George Wallace and Richard Nixon. I have voted in every election since then. I am a Navy veteran.

I am currently the chair of the Napa County Democratic Central Committee. I was also a delegate to the Democratic National Convention in 2020. I am a member of the Veteran's Caucus, the Labor Caucus, the Senior Citizen's Caucus, and the African American Caucus of the CDP.

I am also a member of the Workforce Alliance of the North Bay. I am currently the President of the Napa Solano Central Labor Council. I am a member of two IATSE (stagehands) locals and have been a member of Reno Local 363 since 1978 and San Francisco Local 16 since 1996. I served as the first black President of Local 16 for one term: 2010-2013. I am retired (mostly) but I still serve on the Executive Board of Local 16 and I am also a member of the Local 16 Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Committee.


I have been a leader my entire life, from being the captain of my HS football team, to being an Eagle Scout and a squad leader in Bootcamp, from managing retain stores to being selected as a Subject Matter Expert in creating the first national test for theatrical riggers.

I believe that workers prosper most when they are in a union. We only have to look at the rise and fall of unions and how when unions are strong, the economy is strong. The gap between the workforce and the rich becomes greater when union density is lower. Currently, we are seeing a surge in successful union organizing as more and more workers, especially young workers, are realizing they have more power when they organize and stand together. Part of organizing is finding candidates who recognize that, when they support labor and labor issues, they garner great allies.


Last year I was given the lifetime achievement award from the Napa Solano Central Labor Council. That is the greatest honor of my life and inspires me to do more, especially working to bring in training in schools in the trades and the arts - to show that good jobs are available that don't require college degrees.

I stand with my union brothers, sisters, and kin as we take actions to bring dignity, respect, and fair wages to workers. When union workers prosper, all workers prosper.
